

TANGLEWOOD HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION (SF) RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. **GENERAL:** The following rules and regulations are designed to make living at Tanglewood pleasant and comfortable for each member of the Association. The restrictions which the Board imposes upon the members are for the mutual benefit of all. The cooperation and consideration of each member is vital. Failure to cooperate may result in fines in accordance with NC GS 47F.
2. **DUES:** Annual Homeowner dues are due and payable between the first and last day of January of each year. Any homeowner who is in arrears will be subject to a judgment against them in Wake County Court.
3. **ALTERATIONS:** Prior to any exterior alterations or additions (such as fences, room additions or storage buildings) an architectural request for approval form must be submitted to the Board of Directors for approval. The Board, at its sole discretion, may or may not approve any changes. A written reply to any request will be made within sixty (60) days after said request has been submitted.
4. **YARDS, LAWNS, & HOME EXTERIOR:** Yards and lawns should be maintained in a neat and orderly manner. Grass/weeds should not be allowed to grow more than 8 inches in height. Shrubbery should also be maintained in a neat and orderly manner and pruned on a regular basis. Structures of any type are not allowed in the front yards. All toys and yard equipment should be picked up daily and stored out of sight from the street. Basketball goals are not allowed to be on the street per City of Raleigh Ordinance.

Home Exteriors should be kept in a state of good repair and every effort should be made to maintain the exterior appeal of the home. Maintenance duties that homeowners are responsible for include, but are not limited to: Annual pressure washing; painting of trim, doors, shutters, windows, railings, posts, and other exterior surfaces; gutter cleaning and maintenance; painting and maintenance of mailbox posts and mailboxes; removal of vines, trees, tree limbs or shrubbery growing on or encroaching on the home; attention to blinds, curtains, or other fixtures in front windows that can be seen from the street.
5. **PARKING:** Every effort should be made to park all vehicles in the driveways instead of on the street. The street and cul-de-sac's cannot be used for the storage of extra vehicles. All recreation vehicles and trailers should be parked in the driveways and not on the street. All vehicles parked within Tanglewood must be in operating condition both legally and mechanically, i.e. current license plates & inspection sticker, no flat tires, etc. After written notice of this violation, legal action or fines may be levied against the violator to correct the problem. If this happens, any and all legal cost will be the responsibility of the violator. Commercial vehicles are not allowed on the property without written approval of the Board of Directors.
6. **AUTOMOBILE REPAIRS:** Minor vehicle repairs (oil changing, tire changing, spark plug replacement, etc.) are allowed; however, major repairs (engine overhaul, transmission repair, brake replacement, rear end repairs, etc.) are not allowed. Vehicles are not allowed to be left on jacks or blocks.

7. **SPEED LIMIT:** Special attention should be exercised when driving within the community to insure the safety of all residents. Any resident or homeowner who witnesses violation of the speed limit by another homeowner, resident, or guest should report the vehicle to the City of Raleigh Police Department.
8. **INSURANCE:** The Homeowners Association does not provide insurance for the residential units. It is the responsibility of the owner to provide insurance coverage for the structure.
9. **NOISE:** Being thoughtful of one's neighbors is especially important in a community such as Tanglewood. Loud noises from televisions, stereo equipment, musical instruments, annoying pets, and other disturbances should be avoided at all times, especially between the hours of 11pm and 8am. If a homeowner should be disturbed by a loud noise, he should first attempt to notify the disturbing party. If the disturbing party is uncooperative and the problem is severe, then the local law enforcement agency should be contacted. The management office or a member of the Board of Directors should be contacted the next business day.
10. **RENTERS:** All renters must comply with the rules & regulations, covenants, and by-laws of the Association and should be properly informed of these responsibilities by the owner of the property. Property owners are responsible for the actions of their tenants and may be subject to fines by repeated violations committed by their tenants.
11. **SIGNS:** Only standard size "For Sale or "For Rent" signs are allowed on the property and only one sign per home is permitted.
12. **PETS:** Dogs, cats, and other domestic pets are allowed, provided that they do not disturb or annoy residents or guests. Any inconvenience, damage, excrement or unpleasantness caused by any pet shall be the sole responsibility of its owner. All dogs and cats shall be kept under the DIRECT control of their owners at all times and shall not be allowed to run free or otherwise interfere with the comfort and convenience of any resident or guest. These requirements are in accord with the Raleigh Leash Ordinance. No animals, livestock, or poultry of any kind shall be raised, bred, or kept for commercial purposes.
13. **DWELLINGS:** Each home shall be used for residential purposes only and shall be occupied by no more than two people per bedroom.
14. **MAILBOXES:** Federal Law prohibits any unauthorized entry of mailboxes. Any person in violation will be reported to the Federal Postal authorities. Mailboxes should be maintained in a state of good repair which may include painting, pressure washing, rust removal, or replacement of parts.
15. **HAZARDS:** The discharge of firearms, fireworks, or any other noise making device is not permitted at any time within the boundaries of Tanglewood.
16. **COMMON AREAS:** Every homeowner should protect his interest in the common areas. Please do not abuse these areas by way of littering or in any way restricting the enjoyment of these areas.
17. **SATELLITE DISHES:** The small satellite dishes are allowed, however, it is highly recommended that they be placed so that they are not visible from the street.
18. **GARBAGE COLLECTION:** Trash collection is provided by the City of Raleigh. The City will provide each home with a rolling garbage can. Each trashcan shall be stored in the rear of

the home, out of sight from the street. All garbage for each home shall be placed in the can and rolled to the curb on the day designated by the City as garbage pickup day. Once the garbage has been picked up, owners must return their individual cans to the rear area by sunset the day after the garbage has been picked up. Failure by an owner to return their garbage can to the rear of the home may result in a daily fine until the can is placed back in the rear of the home. Trash cans are not allowed to be kept in the front or on the side of the homes. Violators will be subject to a fine. Recycling: The City of Raleigh provides recycle bins and pick up service for recyclable items (glass, newspapers, plastic containers, etc.) Recycling bins should be kept inside, or in the back, out of sight from the street. **RECYCLING BINS ARE NOT PERMITTED IN THE FRONT OF THE HOMES AS THEY ARE UNSIGHTLY.
